Induction

During your induction, you will receive information about the following:

Fees

- All courses are subsidised by the Education and Skills Funding Agency
- Fees are charged for courses apart from Family Learning courses, courses specifically for learners with learning difficulties and disabilities and courses for volunteers
- Learners in receipt of certain benefits may be entitled to fee remission as long as proof is provided
- If a course has an examination or accreditation fee, learners who are exempt from paying course fees will also be exempt from examination fees
- If a course is cancelled or closed, learners will be refunded for any cancelled sessions
- Learners who leave a course early will not be eligible for a refund

Paperwork

Inspire Learning ask learners to complete just 3 forms during their courses.

Enrolment Form

- Provides us with information about learners who are attending our courses
- Details used to make sure we are attracting learners from our target communities
- Enables us to claim funding from the Education and Skills Funding Agency
- Learners who refuse to complete an Enrolment Form may be asked to pay additional course fees
- All personal information is stored securely

Learner Evaluation Form

- Completed at the end of your course
- Your opportunity to provide us with feedback about your course, helping us to make improvements where necessary


