




Education Library Service Recommended Picture Books Autumn Term 2019



While Harry is recovering, the pace of life is much slower and he has time to sense the world around him. Lovely story about mindfulness, with excellent illustrations by Gemma Merino.

Meanwhile, the creature has been dreaming about his long hard journey to reach safety. Subtle message about refugees and being kind to strangers, but does show rude behaviour. Could be good for classroom discussion.


Newson, Karl		The same but different too

A celebration of all the wonderfully funny things that make us similar and different. Very simple text with amusing illustrations. Really good for sharing.




Quayle		Suzy Orbit, astronaut

But the princesses have other ideas and fearlessly leap in to action. Amusing tale with plenty of daring do and a good resolution. Illustrations complement the text well and have plenty of funny details for children to enjoy poring over.
