Lola Nox is the daughter of a celebrated horror filmmaker and thinks nothing can scare her. But when her father is brutally attacked in their New York apartment, she's swiftly packed off to live with a grandmother she's never met in Harrow Lake, the eerie town where her father's most iconic horror movie was shot. The locals are weirdly obsessed with the film that put their town on the map - and there are strange disappearances, which the police seem determined to explain away, and she is convinced someone is stalking her. The more Lola discovers about the town, the more terrifying it becomes. Because Lola's got secrets of her own. And if she can't find a way out of Harrow Lake, they might just be the death of her. Terrifically creepy atmospheric horror tale, with good characterisation and plenty of eerie weirdness, and a mystery at the heart which keeps the reader's attention. Well written and compelling narrative that would engage even the non-horror enthusiast.

When fifteen-year-old Nathan discovers the body of his older brother Al who has taken his own life, his whole world is torn apart. Al was the talented one in the family who could see beyond the Manchester estate that they live in. Convinced that his brother was in trouble, Nathan decides to retrace Al's footsteps. As he does, he meets Megan, Al's former classmate, who is as determined as Nathan to keep Al's memory alive. Together they start seeking answers, but will either of them be able to handle the truth about Al's death when they eventually discover what happened? Realistic and accessible novel which is very thought provoking. Written in largely short alternate chapters by Nathan and Megan, the story uncovers the bullying Al endured and the betrayal of his lifelong best friend. It shows the awfulness of social media, the trolling and the bullying and how if you are desperate to be part of your teenage peer group, it has a dehumanising effect as you never have to face the people you are destroying.
