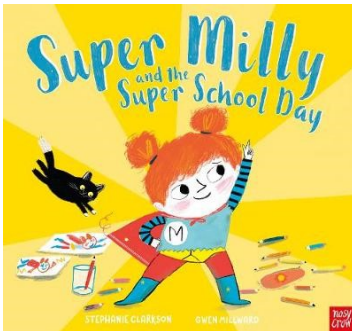


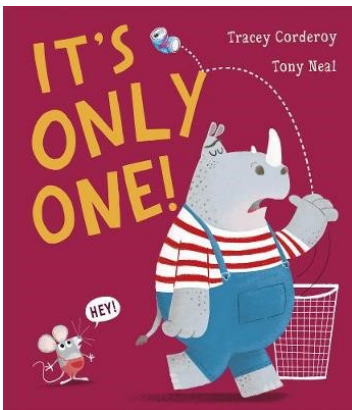

Interest age: 3+ Reading age: 6+

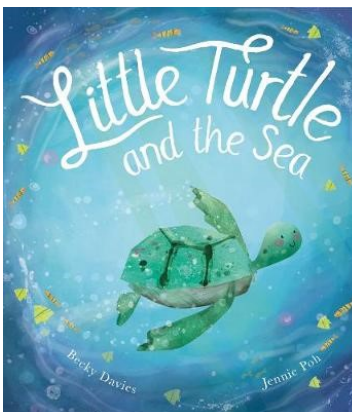

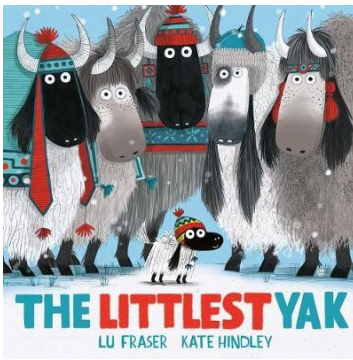

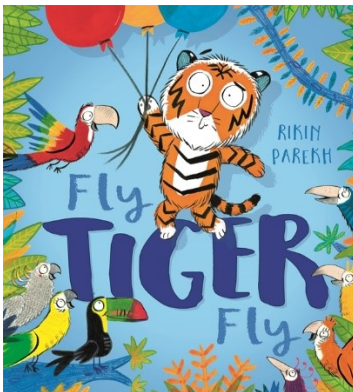


Miller, Pat Zietlow

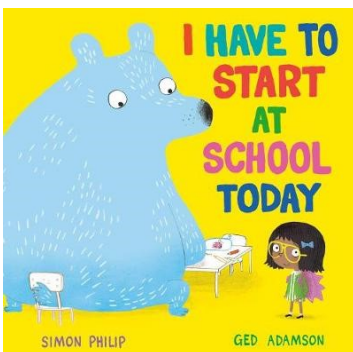


Parekh, Rikin

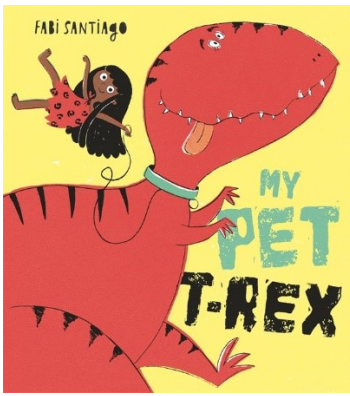


Philip, Simon

A little girl is about to start school but is getting worried especially as her brother tells her that bad things could happen. Told in rhyme which reads aloud extremely well.

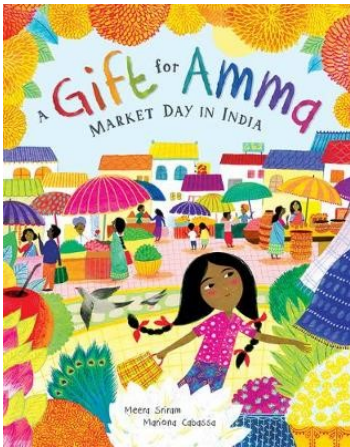
