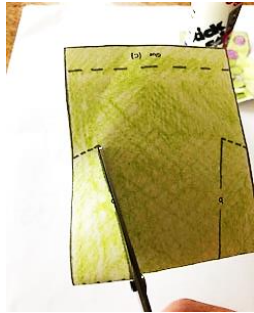


How To: Make a paper frog

You will need a frog template plus:

- Scissors
- Glue
- Coloured pens and pencils

1. Colour in and cut out all body parts of the frog.
Also colour the back of the body, eyes and tongue.



2. Lightly fold the body along the dotted line (a), while folded cut along the two solid internal lines (b), this will create the frog's loopy back legs.

3. Unfold and glue the eyes to the top of the head along the diagonal dashed lines (d).

4. Roll the body into a cylinder, glue the edge (c) to hold the cylinder in place.



5. Assemble the chest by overlapping the V cut to match the dashed line (e).

6. Roll the paper tongue between your fingers to make it curl up.

7. Stick the chest to the front of the frog's body at the dots marked glue (g).
The frog's mouth should appear slightly open, not flat.

8. Fold the front feet on the dashed line, add a little glue at the ankles to fasten them to the body, this will also help to create the rounded chest shape.

9. Finally attach the back feet, stick one under each of the loopy back legs.

10. The loopy legs can then be pulled back at the knees (finished).

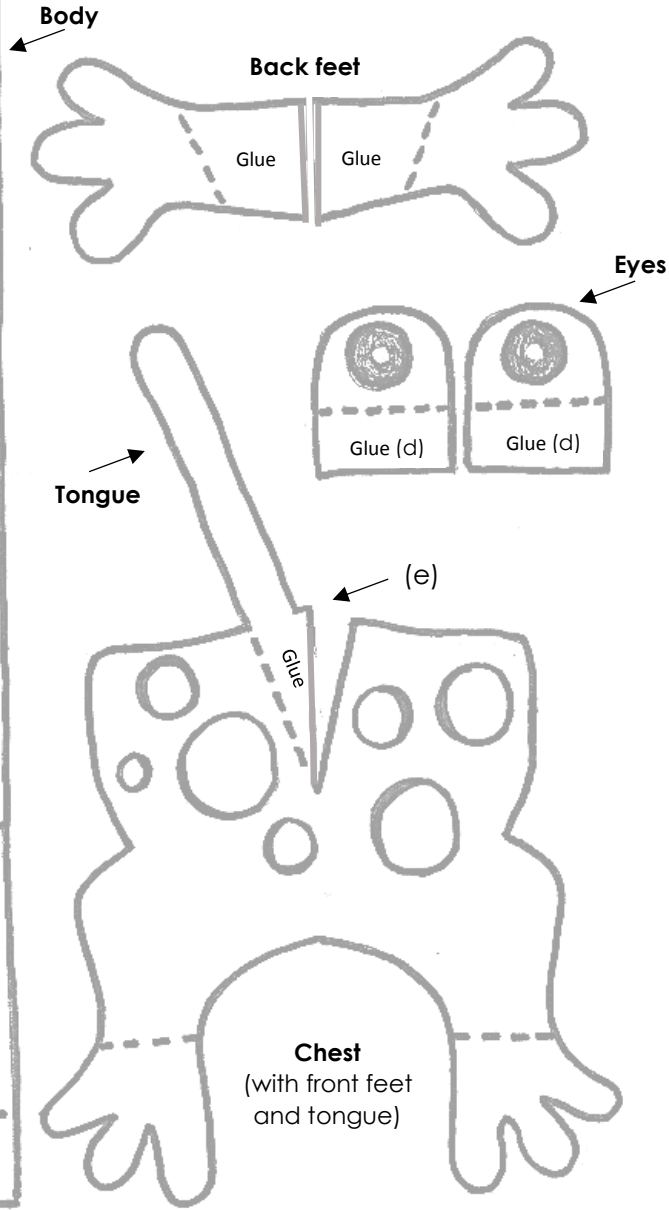
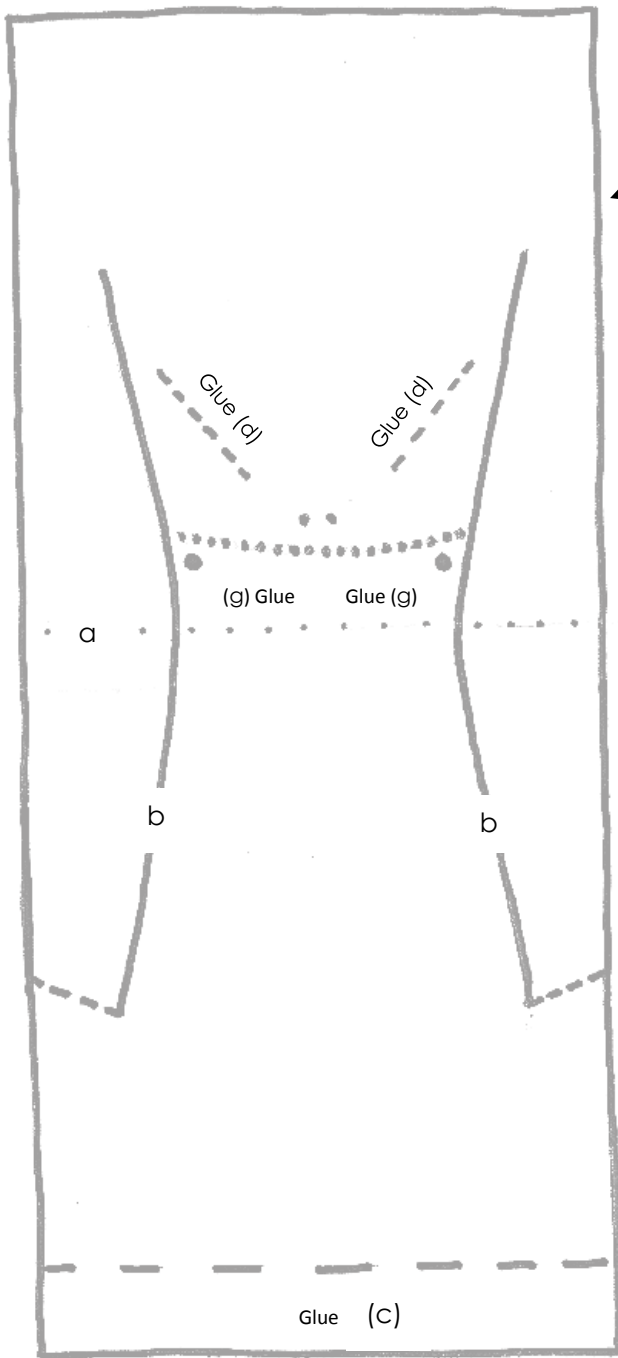
