A 3-year extension to our Arts Council England National **Portfolio Organisation funding has** also been secured, so Inspire Youth Arts will continue our work around arts and disability, digital arts. Plus, our plans to develop a Nottinghamshire Dance Hub are also shaping up!

We will be continuing to showcase work at some of the best venues, a highlight being Nottingham Playhouse in July and our regular BBC introducing gig at Metronome. We will again be hosting Onefest, the LD led festival in Mansfield. Further gigs and events at the Old Library include Propel Dance performance by wheelchair dancers. We hope you enjoy this packed program with young people at the heart of everything we do.

eNGine Room

eNGine Room is a not-for-profit artist development and record label, supporting and showcasing some of the best young talent emerging in Nottinghamshire, and is supported by Inspire and Arts Council England.

eNGineRoom launched in 2021 to develop artists with a focus on a range of tailored support: songwriting, recording, production, performance, marketing and promotional campaigns and releasing - to suit the development of young and emerging musical talent across Notts, and develop them to a level where they can record and produce material for release on the label and for performance at IYA events and showcases, external and partnership events.

eNGineRoom is partnered with a team of associate artists and producers, designed to equip the young musicians with the best advice and tools for the development of their professional careers within the industry. The current artist roster includes ALT BLK ERA, Sam Adams, Jack Chapman & Ashley Westlake, Able Orchestra / Jess Fisher, and BetseyB. The label has already released over 25 singles since May 2021, plus one EP and a full album for the BeiNG Music Festival - and many are achieving great success with thousands of streams on Spotify and other digital platforms. The label also releases special one-off collaborations and projects.

All of the artists have already featured on Dean Jackson's BBC Introducing show on BBC Radio Nottingham's 'The Beat', including interviews and features, as well as national airplay on Radio 1. Three of the artists have also gone on to record NUSIC spotlight sessions, and are starting to grab support slots on established bands' tours, and playing venues such as the Rescue Rooms and The Bodega, as well as venues in Manchester, Leeds and Leicester.

eNGine Room are currently recruiting and looking out for new artists to develop – both from within our successful music programmes and across Nottinghamshire, so contact us with info and demos if you want to get involved.

THE ABLE ORCHESTRA

The Able Orchestra is the UK's first disability led Orchestra, beginning in 2014 and has since worked alongside BBC Concert Orchestra, BBC Symphony Orchestra, The Halle Orchestra and Sinfonia Viva. Able Orchestra has also worked with DJ Switch Petebox and other outstanding music artists. The project is designed for physically disabled young musicians to create both music and digital projection leading to performances at some of the UK's leading venues including the BBC Proms at the Royal Albert Hall!

Arts Council England has agreed 3 years funding to develop the project into a fully operational disability led ensemble using adaptive technology and the latest digital music and arts techniques. The project will be testing out new approaches and sharing the work nationally.

Able Orchestra is looking to create a core ensemble of players to be the leading voice in the music and direction of the project. If you are, or you know someone who is a disabled musician we would like to hear from you!
