A brand-new arts project for children and young people living with diabetes

Hummingbirds is a free visual arts programme for any young person under the age of 25 with diabetes (no experience required)! Led by a professional artist, this project is designed for participants to make it their own. Whether you are looking for an artistic outlet, or the chance to socialise and share experiences with other diabetics living in and around Nottinghamshire, we hope that through the medium of art we can make this happen.

Throughout these sessions you will be able to take part in a range of papercraft activities, including quilling and painting; all artwork created will then be combined to create an exhibition at The Old Library. You are welcome to come to these drop-in sessions between 2 – 4pm for any length of time, and to as many or as few sessions as you would like! Parents/Carers are also welcome to attend and stay with their young person.

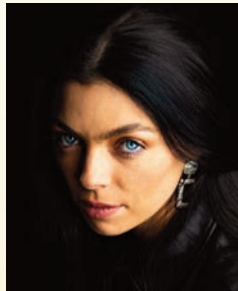
eNGine Room is partnered with a team of associate artists and producers, designed to equip the young musicians with the best advice and tools for the development of their professional careers within the industry.
