Bell, Alex The Lighthouse

Rosie and Jess are spending two weeks with their dad and his new family on an island, called Bird rock, during the school break. It's the last thing Jess wants to do but if her sister is happy and wants to go, so will she. Before they even step foot on the island they become caught in its mystery. Gannets circle and thick mist surrounds the lighthouse, hiding the secrets of a tragic past. Rosie is excited and wants to win a competition by capturing a truly haunted picture to send into a magazine to win £1000 cash prize. Jess doesn't believe in ghosts - but the trip to The Lighthouse on Bird Rock changes her mind. Nightmares haunt their dreams and there seems to be someone, or something, else with them in the lighthouse. Jess and Rosie decide to investigate.

The Lighthouse is a chilling and gripping read, a ghost story with twists and turns.



Burge, Rachel Waking the Witch

Ivy's search for her mother takes her to Bardsey, a remote Welsh island where she uncovers dark secrets about her past. An ancient and corrupted power haunts the island and the only chance of survival for herself and her friend Tom is for her to look deep within herself and address her past. As a child who has grown up in care she has suppressed her feelings for fear of rejection. Well told dark story with plenty of brooding Welsh atmosphere and Arthurian legend mixed with a modern tale of female empowerment. Set up for a sequel.



Darbon, Mel What the World Doesn't See

A powerful novel with an insight into life with learning disabilities and caring for someone who has them. Maudie and Jack's mum has been struggling with grief since their dad died and one night she vanishes. When Maudie's aunt puts Jake into care Maudie decides she has to act and comes up with a plan of kidnapping Jake. Told in alternate chapters from Maudie and Jake's point of view.

A wonderful story, which is very special – a main character with learning disabilties themes of first love and an ultimately hopeful message. Wonderful characters and full of empathy.




David, Keren What We're Scared Of

Interest age: 13+ Reading age: 13+

Evie and Lottie are twin sisters but they couldn't be more different. They go to different schools and are interested in different things. Their Jewish mother has never mentioned their family history or followed religious customs. But then Lottie becomes friends with Hannah who opens her eyes to Judaism and the casual racism of classmates. Evie's eyes are opened by Noah who is trying to act against racists. When the twins' mother gets a high-profile job on radio and is targeted by anti-semitic trolls on social media, the twins try to brush it off at first but then it gets more dangerous. In the aftermath, they attend a talk by Mala Tribich - a very real Holocaust survivor. A page-turner with short chapters, told from both twins' points of view, and engaging characters. Highlights anti-semitism today, as well as it being a story about friendships and sibling relationships.



Galvin, Lindsay My Friend the Octopus

A historical novel revolving around a giant octopus and a sinister mystery in a Victorian aquarium. Twelve-year-old Vinnie Fyfe has been taken by her milliner mother to live with her aunt. Whilst waiting for her mum to return from Paris, the arrival of a giant octopus changes Vinnie's life for ever. She soon realises she can communicate with the octopus through colour and - as a gripping mystery begins to unfold - discovers what true courage really means...

A gripping Victorian mystery with a touching connection between a young girl and an octopus at its heart.



Hoghton, Anna Orla and the Wild Hunt

When Orla and her younger brother Apollo go to stay with their beloved gran in Ireland, they are hoping for normality and comfort after the death of their Mother. But soon after they arrive, Gran vanishes, and Orla is confronted by the shape-shifting darkness known as the Wild Hunt. To save their gran from the Wild Hunt, they soon find themselves on a dangerous quest to bring back the magical Harp of Dagda. But the children need help in this quest, and soon are accompanied by some very unlikely, and not necessarily trustworthy creatures of myth and legend. Can they finally outwit the Wild Hunt in time to save gran?

The true story of her death is far more terrifying than any ghost tale Gabe has told.

Kuki has moved to a coastal town in Nigeria with her mother and new stepfather. She struggles to make friends at school and becomes targeted mercilessly by the class bully Moji.To make matters worse, her new aunty is convinced that Kuki is being haunted by an Abiku (a malevolent spirit child), and she will die on her 13th birthday. One evening whilst out exploring, Kuki discovers an abandoned beach house with an overgrown garden full of scattered sea shells, and makes friends with the mysterious Enilo. As her problems at school intensify, she then makes a horrifying discovery about Enilo.
