However, Nisha must follow her stern grandmother's countless rules, and the culture shock is huge. But, then Nisha hears a ghost child calling her name from the old crooked "weeping tree" high on the cliff top, challenging her to find three treasures before the next full moon. Nisha can hardly believe what is happening, and as she explores the old house and the island, she begins to make some surprising discoveries. Grips from the very start of the narrative and is a compelling war story with a difference. The central characters are very believable, and Nisha is relatable. Very good descriptive world building, and the development of the mystery also keeps the reader engaged. The spooky book cover would also intrigue potential readers. Very enjoyable read.
