Davis, Ben My Brilliant Plan to Fix Everything



Alex convinces his dad into thinking he has a writing sabbatical and works out a way to take over his dad's postal route, giving his dad time to write his book and become the successful, happy man he needs to be. Which he hopes will result in his mum and dad getting back together again. But Alex quickly learns postal work is a bit trickier than it might seem; there's the school bullies who throw his letters in the canal, an overly suspicious boss, and a lot of angry dogs to get through. Not to mention Willow, the girl on the canal who starts to help Alex but has a dark secret that might derail everything...

As the weeks go by, Alex starts to appreciate how much his dad means to the people in the community. But the lies are piling up, and as Alex's ruse starts to fall apart, he needs his dad more than ever - successful author or not.

A very emotional and thoughtful story told from the point of view of Alex. Strong characterisation and development of relationships. Fundamental message is that life is forever changing, we can't live in the past but must adapt and grasp the opportunities that are offered.




Dylan, Gabriel Shiver Point – It came from the woods

The first in the Shiver Point series where a group of children aim to save their town. Shiver Point is also the town where they live and where nothing interesting happens and there's not anything fun to do. Alex has just moved to the town with his Mum and misses his former home and friends. Then one night, he spots what looks like a meteorite plummeting into Howlmoor Forest. Intrigued, he later goes to investigate. And finds four other kids from his school have seen the strange streak in the sky: 'troublemaker' Oli, studious Sophia, curious Mo and budding engineer Riley. There seems to be a plague of slug-like creatures that explode when exposed to light. The slimy things seem to be controlled by a bloodthirsty body snatcher who tries to break into Alex's home. Then all the town's adults begin to be seized by some kind of zombie-like state. The children will have to join together to overcome the heinous threat to the town.

Well written horror story for top KS2 / KS3.




Foster, Stewart All The Way Down

Gradually they work through their individual fears and secrets whilst they are waiting to be rescued.

Well written in usual Stewart Foster style with empathy and great characters and plot.

A fun action-packed adventure story, with Lucia being a very positive character and wearing hearing aids




Nabi, Zohra The Kingdom Over the Sea



Now Rose must keep the stone from falling into the wrong hands and embark on a quest to find its rightful owner and keep the magic alive. Exciting quest novel, with an engaging central character that readers will root for. Full of Irish mythology mixed in with the real world which fantasy fans will love. Includes very useful glossaries at the back. The narrative really grips the reader and the twists in the plot and the increase in jeopardy keep the reader hooked. 

On Nani's first day in the UK, they discover that an eccentric millionaire has set up a fiendish treasure hunt, which will be an ideal subject for Rani's article. Others are trying to solve the clues, and wannabe journalist Lexi is filming everything and getting it wrong. Starring a pet parrot, a granny bursting with energy and a resourceful girl, this is the first in a fun young series.

Tips on being a journalist are at the back, a recipe for Mauritian chilli cakes and a glossary of the Mauritian Creole words which Nani uses. The font is large and there are black and white illustrations throughout this romp of a story. Great fun and ideal reading for pleasure.

Ten-year-old Jack is shipwrecked and stranded on a desert island with no way to get home. He discovers the island has ample fresh water, plenty of food and two unusual inhabitants, one of whom befriends him. But Jack is desperate to return home to England, and when he and his friend uncover not one, but two quite different and incredible hidden treasures on the little island, he starts to formulate a daring and dangerous plan. But the open ocean is full of danger from it's inhabitants, the weather and those who sail upon it. If Jack's going to succeed he will need to be very, very lucky.

Excellent and unusual adventure tale which nods at a number of classic works of literature in a very subtle and imaginative way. Very well-written narrative with a good use of sophisticated vocabulary which would stretch young readers. Superb characterisation, and the twists and turns of the plot really keep the reader enthralled. An old fashioned adventure tale for the champion reader. Could also make a very good teacher read to a class.
