Bond, Ash Peregrine Quinn and the cosmic realm

Peregrine Quinn has always loved hearing her godfather Daedalus Bloom's stories about his life as an immortal, but that's all they were - stories. That is, until the portals that connect the Terran Realm with the Cosmic Realm mysteriously shut down and Daedalus, the only one who can fix them, is kidnapped. Peregrine is then swept into a nail-biting adventure, helped by a dryad and a faun, who must fix the portals and rescue Daedalus before an ancient evil rises and chaos takes over. Great fun fantasy adventure with feisty characters and plenty of jeopardy to keep readers interested right through to the end. Great start to a new series.



Crosby, Polly The Vulpine

Ora has always been fascinated by chilling fairy stories of the Vulpine; hideous monsters who live below ground, emerging at night to snatch 'imperfect' babies and children. Because Ora's world is trying to eradicate disability and illness, and the only way to succeed in life is to be genetically 'perfect'. But when her friend Casta's baby sister disappears, and then shockingly Ora finds out she has a genetic lung illness, her world is turned upside down. Super dystopian sci-fi mystery adventure with a compelling central character in Ora, and an exciting narrative that grips the reader's attention from the start. Good underlying message of accepting and valuing difference. Good leisure read.



Fox, James The boy in the suit

Solo just wants to be normal, have a proper school uniform and fit in to the crowd. But money is scarce for him and his mum, and she often comes up with imaginative ways to solve their money problems, such as gate crashing funerals for free food. So, when Solo and his mum gate crash the funeral of a celebrity and get caught, the press make them a viral sensation. Solo's pursuit of security, community and connection is poignant and uplifting, and the central characters are very relatable. Super read for empathy with regard to poverty and mental health. A laugh while you're crying read.



Hayden, Chaz Diet soda club

Reed's little sister has a debilitating condition that means many stays in hospital. When there is the offer of a potentially life-enhancing operation, Reed is determined that she should have it. But, life becomes ever harder for them both when their mother leaves them with her new boyfriend to fend for themselves. With no job prospects on the horizon, Reed begins making and selling fake IDs so he and Bea can survive. But the problems keep piling up, from an angry landlord demanding rent to looming medical bills. Very well-written narrative with empathy for both Reed and his sister, and the reader starts to care about the characters and their struggles from the start. There are lots of strong themes handled sensitively, from the issue of being a young carer, taking responsibility when parents can't cope, and issues around medical transplants. Nevertheless, this is an uplifting story well told.



Hayes, Larry The nightmares of Finnegan Quick

Finnegan Quick is haunted by nightmares. So much so, that he's terrified of going to sleep. Because Finn's dreams actually change the waking world with horrific consequences. He has already lost his mum, his dad, his dog, and now the monsters are coming for his gran. Then a mysterious girl starts appearing in his dreams, helping Finn to fight back against the creatures. But, then Cass appears at Finn's school in real life and tells him she can help him solve the mystery of his missing parents. Together with Finn's best friend Squid, they set about battling the monsters of nightmare. Fast paced horror adventure with engaging central characters and plenty of plot twists, jeopardy and monster battles to keep readers turning the pages. Some blood and gore, but nothing too graphically described. Good start to a new horror series




McNicoll, Elle Some like it cold



A light but enjoyable romance for young teens dealing well with the issue of fitting in when you are different.

A compelling historical mystery story. Well written with great characters and plot.

Until fate finally intervenes and two new mysterious boys join drama club: Peter, who's just moved from New York and his best friend, Sam. Patch is confident that one of them will be his first boyfriend. So, armed with his over-supportive best friend Jean and an alarming level of self-confidence, Patch sets out to make his mission a success. Whether or not they actually like boys or him is a problem for later. Romantic comedy for older teens, very entertaining read.

Because sometimes betrayal isn't as simple as it seems and revenge certainly isn't as easy, not when your heart is involved. Gripping from the outset with pacey action, a feisty female lead, strong cultural references and a well-developed plot. Includes violence and harsh treatment of those in captivity.
