

With the help of best mate Jonah and quiet genius Carolina, he hatches a plot to pay back what his mum owes using Chick's own ill-gotten gains. It's not a fool-proof plan, and it's not helped by Sonny's Tourette's making him blab very loud under stress, but he feels it's down to him to save his family. Sonny is a very well drawn and likeable character and the first person narrative really gets across his OCD and how he deals with the world around him. Dark and funny narrative with plenty of details to keep the reader's attention.

He keeps his head down at school and works hard on his football skills, striving to meet his father's high expectations and 'be a man'. But what that means isn't always clear-cut. When Morgan makes a friend at school, gets injured in a game, and his long-lost mum turns up, everything changes. Then, when he meets an old woman in need of help, Morgan must decide what kind of man he wants to be. Very compelling character driven narrative that grips the reader from the beginning, with intense dark themes of bullying and misogyny. Nevertheless, a satisfying and quality read.





Very engaging story with a central character that readers will really root for.
