

Evoking resilience, humour and the changing fortunes of a proud community, *The Undisputed King of Selston* shines a light on a way of life that shaped both a village and an era.

AROUT THE AUTHOR

Danny Scott grew up in Selston, serving his apprenticeship as an engineer on leaving school, before moving to London in the 1980s. After a job in counterespionage, he became a private investigator, then a painter and decorator, then an engineer again, before becoming a journalist and interviewing people like Sir Paul McCartney, Mikhail Gorbachev, Usain Bolt and Dave Hill from Slade. He lives in Essex with his wife and their young son.



Heritage Talk

2pm / Wednesday 10 December

For many families, the arrival of the Christmas edition of The Radio Times signalled the start of the festive season. In this talk, local historian Robert Mee will look at the changing nature of the magazine, from the first edition in 1923 until 1999. He will also look at the programmes offered by the BBC on Christmas Day - there will no doubt be an element of nostalgia for days-past, but broadcasting trends and improvements in technology will also be covered.

This illustrated talk, by local authors and researchers Dave Pickersgill and John Stocks, tells the half-forgotten story of what was once one of Worksop's foremost industries. 




