



When can I start?

This is flexible – you can start anytime.

Our bases are open from September to July. The programme is personalised to you and you work at your own pace. You're also given time off over summer, at Christmas and Easter, as well as half-term breaks.

Will I get paid?

We pay a bursary to all students aged 16-19 (up to 24 with an EHCP; the rate is dependent upon your circumstances).

Travel is only paid to 16-19s or up to 24 with EHCP.

What's a Study Programme?



On our Study Programmes, you'll work with us for 3 days per week towards a recognised City and Guilds or Aim Awards qualification, as well as maths and English.

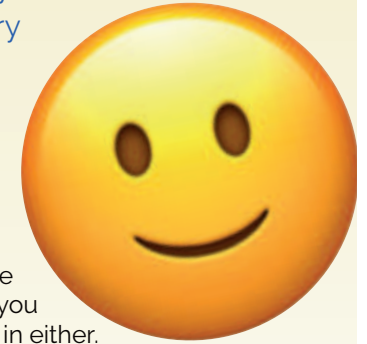
Study programmes at Newark

- **Level 1 and 2 Aim Awards in Employability which includes units on Personal and Social Development, Teamwork, Customer Service and Emotional Resilience.**
- **GCSE Maths and English (for students who have achieved a D/3).**
- **City and Guilds Functional Skills in Maths and English.**
- **Work experience is also an integral part of the programme, with all young people having the opportunity to access both community work and an individual, personalised work placement during their time with us.**

What's a Traineeship?

A Traineeship lasts up to 6 months and involves extended work experience for which you are paid a daily bursary whilst in placement.

We help you to find work experience in an area suitable for you and help you to improve your employability skills, build your CV, as well as improve your maths and English if you are yet to achieve a C or 4 in either.
