We also offer introductions to learning which are fun and informative and allow you to learn at your own pace. There is truly something for everyone.

Our 19+ Advanced Learner Loan funded provision is offering more programmes at Level 3 and 4 including Access to Higher Education and the Certificate in Education and Training to name a few. Last year, our Access to Higher Education students achieved a 100% success rate progressing to local universities to continue their studies.

We're also growing our successful Apprenticeship provision, working with a number of local employers to support their employees to gain valuable qualifications in work and progress their careers. Our 16 - 24 young adult provision is expanding. We're now offering learning from nine centres across Nottinghamshire, including: Retford Young People's Centre; Ollerton Young People's Centre; Worksop Library; My Place at Westfield Folkhouse Young People's Centre; Eastbourne House, Sutton-in-Ashfield; Newark Library; Eastwood Young People's Centre; Stapleford Young People's Centre; and Hucknall Library. Our programmes are offering young adults the opportunity to learn new skills and gain qualifications before progressing to further education, training and employment.



Association of Project Management with Inspire Learning

Inspire Learning is an Association of Project Management (APM) accredited centre and we're offering The Project Management Qualification (PMQ) (IPMA Level D, SCQF Level 7), developed by APM, the Chartered body for the project profession.

The qualification is a knowledge based qualification allowing you to demonstrate understanding of all elements of project management.

What will you learn?

The course covers a wide range of topics. You'll gain a broad understanding of project management terminology, basic techniques and the people skills needed to successfully manage a project.

Level 3 Certificate Coaching and Mentoring

The Institute for Leadership and Management (ILM) Level 3 Certificate in Coaching and Mentoring is for those who are expected to coach and mentor in their existing role. No experience is necessary but as part of the course you will need to log at least 36 hours of practice.

What will you learn?

The Coaching and Mentoring Certificate will help you boost and develop the skills and knowledge needed to progress your career in this field.

The course covers:

- Understanding different coaching and mentoring models.
- Development of practical skills and tools to support these models.
- Using new practical skills to deliver mentoring and coaching.
- Reflection and planning to improve coaching and mentoring skills.

Assessment

There will be 4 written assignments to complete in your own time and you'll need to prepare, record and reflect on each coaching and mentoring session you deliver.

Cost and flexible payments

The cost of the course is £595.

Flexible payment options are available or through a 19+ Advanced Learner Loan which we can help you apply for. With a 19+ Advanced Learner Loan, you don't pay anything back until you're earning above £25,000.

Level 3 Award in Education and Training

The Level 3 Award in Education and Training is an introduction to the teaching, learning and development (including practical teaching skills) which reflect the context in which you teach.

This qualification is suitable for those who work or wish to work as teachers in adult community education; teachers/trainers in the voluntary sector; and training personnel in commerce, industry, the public sector or HM forces.

You will need a good standard of English, maths and IT, and ideally hold a qualification at level 2, but this can be gained whilst on the course.

You will need to have good communication skills both written and verbal.

It is also recommended that you hold a level 3 or equivalent in the subject matter you are teaching.

What will you learn?

You'll learn skills to enable you to refine and improve your teaching and learning. You'll also learn constructive reflection to enhance your continuing professional development.

The course is made up of 3 units, which focus on the roles, responsibilities, relationships within the classroom and the use of different types of assessment.

Assessment

The practical assessment of this teaching course requires 1 hour of micro-teaching practice which includes observing other tutors in practice.

Cost and flexible payments

Our one week intensive course costs £395 and our 12 week course costs £495. Payments can be made in easy instalments – please ask us for details.

What are the progression opportunities upon completion?

This course will allow you to become a teacher or tutor in the Further Education and skills sector. You will become very employable by colleges, training organisations or any company providing in-house training. Upon completion you could consider progression to either the Level 4 Certificate in Education and Training or our Diploma in Education and Training. **Our Level 4 qualification starts in September 2019 and is eligible for funding through a 19+ Advanced Learner Loan**.

Level 5 Award in Leadership and Management

The Institute for Leadership and Management (ILM) Level 5 Award in Leadership and Management is intended for those already in a middle management role who want to boost their skills and improve personal performance as they move towards a senior management position.

What will you learn?

The award consists of two units which aim to improve your understanding of effective leadership and skills to implement innovation and change:

Becoming an Effective Leader

- Understand leadership style and develop emotional intelligence.
- Evaluate your own ability to lead and manage.

Leading Innovation and Change

- Understand the need for organisational change.
- Propose innovative solutions and lead/manage the change.

Assessment

There are 2 written assignments to be completed in your own time.

Cost and flexible payments

The cost of the course is £499.

Payments can be made in easy instalments – please ask us for details.

What are the progression opportunities upon completion?

This qualification could help you progress on to a Level 5 certificate or diploma in Leadership and Management.

Alternatively, you may wish to progress to our Project Management Qualification (PMQ).

Level 5 Diploma in Education and Training

The Diploma in Education and Training is designed to allow teachers to develop practical skills which reflect the context in which they teach. It is aimed at those wanting to teach adults in colleges, community settings, or as a volunteer. The requirement is to be observed delivering in the setting, so you must already be teaching. The course is aimed at those teaching 14+ learners.

Eligibility

- You need to provide evidence that you can achieve the required teaching practice, i.e. at least 100 hours.
- You should be able to achieve Level 2 as a minimum in your English, Mathematics and ICT skills.
- You should hold a level 3 qualification in your specialist area.
- You will be required to provide a current DBS check.

What will you learn?

- Developing Teaching, Learning and Assessment in Education and Training.
- Teaching, Learning and Assessment in Education and Training.
- Theories, Principles and Models in Education and Training.
- Wider Professional Practice and Development in Education and Training.
- Plus a choice of optional units over the duration of the course.

Assessment

You will have to complete 4 mandatory assignments and up to 6 optional units.

Cost and flexible payments

The cost of the course will be £1999.

Flexible payment options are available and payments can be made in easy instalments. Please contact us for details.

What are the progression opportunities upon completion?

This qualification will allow you to progress to a BA Honors in Education and Qualified Teaching and Learning status.

Access to Higher Education - Health and Social Care

Do you want to go to university but don't have the qualifications you need? Access courses are for people aged 19+ who want to go to university but who may not have been in education for some time.

Our Access to Health and Social Care course will run at The Old Library, Mansfield and Beeston Library on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday mornings from September 2019.

The course costs £2,850, however Advanced Learner Loans are available to cover this cost. If you progress on to a degree course the loan is written off so that you won't have to repay it.

Getting you back into work

The Building Better Opportunities Towards Work programme benefits people of all ages across Bassetlaw, Newark and Sherwood, and Ollerton districts, who are unemployed and interested in getting back into work, education or training.

Participants are supported by a Work Coach and Job Broker to develop an action plan, to help them achieve their job goals. Towards Work offers personalised and tailored solutions to support an individual's journey to personal progression and employment. The project links individuals with specialist local support and continued in-work services, resulting in job retention.

The project can help people obtain industry-standard training, for example, SIA Door Supervisor qualification and as a result has seen several people receive offers of full-time employment.

Courses for people with learning difficulties and disabilities

We work extensively with people who have learning and physical disabilities (LLDD). We also work with people who have mental health or other related needs. These courses are not advertised generally but are designed for pre-existing groups. Last year we supported 3922 learners with learning and physical disabilities. We're proud of the learning experiences we're able to offer students, who might otherwise not be able to access learning.

Our courses for disabled people are for learners aged 19+, are free of charge and are taught by skilled tutors who are excellent in their field.

The courses are available in a variety of subjects, including:




